"I had the opportunity to find hobbies and subjects that I could do well at school.

"My parents and teachers told me to perceive failure in a positive light. I thus saw failure as a journey and opportunity." Many successful dyslexics attribute their success to the opportunity given at school and college to showcase their strengths in areas like photography, sailing, design, arts, music and ability to work on your own thus kindling the entrepreneurial spirit. These out-of-thebox thinkers have not only overcome the challenges of dyslexia, but have excelled beyond their own and others' expectations. Their success stories are a testament to the human spirit.

I changed ten schools before I found a place that understood me and loved me for who I am.As long as I remember, I always had a problem with studies and failed all subjects in school. My school teachers were fed up with me and didn't know how to teach me. This upset my father and he didn't know what to do with me. Whatever he tried to do to make me study didn't work, and that included corporal punishment. In all this my mother supported me and believed I was capable of making a life for myself. Both my siblings did very well in studies and that added to my woes of failure. All this changed when I joined Alpha to Omega Learning Centre.

I stepped into the portals of Alpha to Omega Learning Centre at the age when I should take my Class 10 board exam with the reading and writing ability of a Class 2 child. Within one year my teachers wrought a change in me, especially Sudha ma'am and Lalitha ma'am. I was able to complete Class 10 and Class 12 through NIOS. But the struggle didn't stop. It followed me through the Hotel Management course which I passed with a lot of difficulty. After this I didn't "fit in" the hospitality industry and was wondering what to do with myself, when a chance suggestion by my brother changed my life.

As a child, I was always fascinated with stones and gems and would always "fiddle" with them. My brother asked me to apply to the Indian Diamond Institute in Surat. I was one of the two students among 150 students who took the qualifying entrance exam and gained admission into the institute. After topping my course, I went on to work in Mumbai, Dubai and in South Africa and gained experience in sourcing and selling diamonds. I eventually returned to Chennai and set up my own diamond wholesale and retail business. I make diamond jewellery. I am very happy. What is the secret of my success? The desire to succeed when I know I have the ability to do better than the other person who has a talent to smooth talk and clinch a deal. I may not be able to do that but because I am not afraid to fail, I am able to take greater risks and be more creative. Don't be afraid, just go ahead and do it. Work hard and you will find success.

"Indisciplined, demotivated and downright lazy" was a phrase whose frequency I had gotten quite used to hearing; being used liberally by a string of teachers from past institutions to communicate their displeasure of having me in their classes. And if that wasn't enough to add to my already lengthy string of troubles; my parents began to seek "professional help" from some rather questionable people at a time I would not look back to in search of fond memories.

We reached a point where the administration of my

then school, promptly decided to detain me on the grounds of failing a single subject, and that did not sit well with me or my parents. They vetted out all that they saw was not required or was unworthy of, and in place installed knowledge and values for a better future. I began enjoying subjects that I had detested strongly and even discovered that the person teaching that subject was all that was needed to make a significant difference in my attitude towards it.

By some miracle, I with my modest abilities and little imagination had managed to grow out of my shell and was now ready to embrace all the challenges the world was about to throw at me. The first being a collective decision to return back to conventional education. After completing grade 10, I was placed in Lady Andal at the recommendation of Ananya for the remainder of the two years of my higher education. This gestation period was necessary to set the track and tone for building a character and personality that was required of me, in order to repel my naturally ingrained introverted nature. It allowed my mind to expand in creativity as well as concentrate on what was necessary.

I had for some time now, informally involved myself in a handful of summer internships that would play a major role in setting the foundation of my career. Working in multiple fields in the creative industry was a crucial trial and error process to get firsthand experience on what was to be offered. I had worked over my summer holidays with a publisher, an advertiser, an architect and an interior designer. Design was not a traditional choice since my family was from a predominantly business background. Nevertheless, I was given the freedom to have my pick and was openly supported by my parents.

Upon completing my schooling, I was enrolled by merit to the Srishti School of Art, Design and Technology in Bangalore, where I completed a year's foundation course in Design. Subsequently, I joined the Raffles Institute of Design in Bangalore to specialize my under-grad studies in Interior Design for the next three years.

With continued support from Ms.Pandit and the teachers, I did quite well.It was at this juncture, in the 12th standard, that I developed an interest in sailing.

I took part in the under-18 World Championship in Poland, and for the next 3 years participated in regattas all over Europe. Iwas offered a sports scholarship at Sydney University and did a degree course in Media and Journalism. I continued with sailing while studying and was instrumental in starting the Sailing Club at the college. What saw me through college was the continuous support and encouragement that I received from my grandmother and my parents. I then worked for a European company as their Social Media Co-ordinator and have covered sporting events like the Olympics.

"Ajay went through school not realising he had a learning problem," says my mother Aysha. "Early intervention helped him to a great extent. Without Ms. Pandit's help he would not have gone forward. She had such a calming effect on him that he would go to her house with his books, to study all by himself". Just as sports has helped me learn discipline, focus and team-work, music has also played an important role in developing my self-confidence. I play the saxophone and have earned accolades for my performances. I now work for the sports retailing company Decathalon, in charge of their water sports division at Melbourne.

Neha was featured in the June 2018 edition of Verve magazine as an empowered woman and rightly so. She is an innovator and a sustainability advocate and has been responsible for developing printing ink from industrial pollutant and waste bye product. As part of her post-graduation studies in sustainable textile design from Chelsea College of Art and Design, University of Arts London; she researched and developed the dye made from "soot" which can be used for printing on fabric as well as paper. For this innovation, Neha was awarded the "India's Best Design Project 2017" for SOOT by Pool magazine.

Neha's journey into design began as a distraction from Dyslexia. Thankfully in her case, the journey began early when she was diagnosed with Dyslexia in the first standard itself. She was tested at Maharashtra Dyslexia Association and followed aneight-year remediation programme at our Deonar Centre thereafter under the guidance of Special Educator ManekChitalwala. Her mother took this information in her stride and ensured she equipped herself with every information on the subject to ensure that Neha got the necessary support she would need. Mrs. Rao has been hands-on in Neha's academic progress and sat with her to study right up to the 10th standard. Neha's father, on the other hand, took a slightly different approach and focused on introducing her to different skills and gradually his interest in arts rubbed off on Neha unknowingly moving her towards her calling. In design, Neha found a way to connect to the world around her. Being accepted into the National Institute of Design was like coming home for her. The way design was taught in this prestigious institution, in Neha's own words, "was more suited for a person with Dyslexia. NID was more me." Growing up, getting through every school day wasn't easy. Though an average student, Neha needed extra time to finish her exam papers and was always bullied for it. Her batchmates seemed jealous and her teachers resented it. Neha didn't want anyone to know she had Dyslexia and even when her mother came to explain her condition, the school professionals indicated that Mrs. Rao might be overthinking on account of being a medical professional.

A turning point in Neha's life came when along with her family she was invited by Maharashtra Dyslexia Association to the screening of TaareZameen Par. Throughout the movie, Neha saw her entire life being projected on the screen and though the movie left her in tears, it also gave her the realization that she wasn't alone. She stopped caring about trying to hide her condition and began a journey of self-discovery. The more she

experimented with arts and crafts, the more she realized she was a visual person. An aptitude test helped cement her path to design and she immersed herself in the field. Overtime Neha realised she had gotten the better end of the deal when she discovered that most of the people in her field were affected by Dyslexia. She says, "I went through 8-10 years of remediation and I started early. There were people in my Master's programme who were just discovering that they are Dyslexic. In that regard, Maharashtra Dyslexia Association was such a blessing for me."

Talking about the future Neha shares, "I used to be a planner but I am more flexible now. I want to keep exploring." Neha extends her design philosophy to her life where she wants to keep looking at new and different ways to do things. At BOHECO, as a Hemp Fabric Curator, her role allows her to design fabric and research innovative materials with sustainability at its core.

She was recently invited by Leeds University to present her paper on the sustainable dye she had developed. When talking about her experience that was both unnerving and exciting, Neha, channeling zen-like wisdom says, "Life is not easy, but it gets easier."

TRAINING PROGRAMME IN SRI LANKA
