Friends,

We have had a very active year 2023. This was the first year when we stopped feeling the negative effects of Covid. All our activities were running on full steam.

Our assessors and part-time remediation department worked very well and met their targets. Our Training Team completed over 80 training programmes of different kinds. We established. 15 more new Resource Rooms adding the total to nearly 150 numbers. Our full time remediation center- Ananya- opened up completely for in-person classes this year.

For the first time we established a Resource Room for pre-primary children. Our Resource Rooms programmes were found very successful by Cognizant Foundation, who are our regular supporters and they chose to sanction a grant of Rs.1 crore to us for establishing some more Resource Rooms in the coming year. We conducted our first intensive training program in Bangalore.

We have been dreaming for a long time for Madras Dyslexia Association to have its own roof and this may come true in the times to come and as a first step we have procured a piece of land in Raja Annamalaipuram and we hope to put up a 9000 sq.ft building in the near future.

Madras Dyslexia Association is growing year after year and we keep upgrading our techniques and modernizing our approach to fulfilling our dreams. We are extremely happy with the support that we are getting from all of you.

ANANYA LEARNING & RESEARCH CENTER

Fulltime remedial support is essential for children with dyslexia in the severe range. Ananya Learning & Research Center is our initiative in this direction; it is being run successfully for over 25 years.

Children formally assessed with dyslexia are remediated to build and sustain academic skills by enhancing their essential skills, executive functions, emotional wellness, innate intelligences etc. in a non-competitive ambience.

Year after year, children have been able to enroll in a suitable curriculum in mainstream schools.





AFTER-SCHOOL REMEDIAL CENTER

Individualised remedial support after the school hours provides the much needed scaffolding for children with dyslexia in the mild-moderate range.

Strategies for academic skills are built and reinforced in this center through in-person and online classes. The schedules are customised to suit the child's day and requirements.

In addition to providing remedial support for the academic skills viz reading, spelling, writing and/or mathematics the children are given opportunities to develop and showcase their innate talents; this being a proactive step towards enhancing their self-esteem and happiness.







SCREENING & ASSESSMENT

Individualised education plan requires a good understanding of the child's strengths, needs and current level of performance in each of the academic areas.

At Madras Dyslexia Association, assessors are equipped to conduct assessment for children from pre-primary to high school. The assessment report gives detailed analysis of the child's performance in various standardised tests leading to wellinformed inference of the strengths and needs followed by recommendations for appropriate support. The recommendations are not limited to remedial support, they include classroom accommodations and exam concessions, wherever applicable.

In the year 2023 290 assessments were conducted.
